We are committed to the continuity of learning for our students therefore protecting the health and safety of our students and families, and employees is a priority. #### **Student Arrival**

School Gates open at 7:15am for students. Students are not allowed on campus before 7:15am. Students have an option to wear a face mask/covering upon entry into the school campus. We would like to inform our parents/guardians that Astumbo Elementary is enforcing a "**DROP and GO**" morning Drop Off procedure.

#### Office Hours/Meetings/ Request for School Documents

Main Office Hours will be from 8:30am to 2:00pm. Only two (2) visitors are allowed in the main office lobby. Please ring the doorbell for assistance. All visitor(s) or Parent/Guardian meetings will be by appointment only to address any concerns or to request for school documents/withdrawals/registration or unless arranged by the school administrator or office staff.

#### **Visitors**

Please be aware that as per GDOE policy, all visitors are required to sign in at the main office. Please note that "Any person found on school campus without permission from the principal shall be guilty of a misdemeanor". Government Code of Guam, Section 11503. This is to ensure protection and safety of our faculty/staff and students on campus.

Visitors will be entertained from 8:30am to 2:00pm. Visitors will not be entertained during student arrivals and dismissals to avoid congestion. All visitors will adhere to the following guidelines:

- Wearing a face mask/ covering is optional upon entry into the school campus.
- \* All visitors are required to check into the main gate with the Gate keeper.

#### Front and Back Gate Walkers

Front and back gate opens at 7:15am and closes at 8:15am. Student(s) are to wait at the front/back walker gate until a staff opens the gate. Face mask covering is optional.

#### **Dismissal**

Please take note that dismissal is at 2:43pm, once all the buses leave the campus, to minimize the exposure on campus, parents will not be allowed to enter the campus to pick up their children. We ask that you wait by the front/back gate as your child is escorted to the designated gate. Please keep the 6ft physical distancing. On rainy days, please be prepared to bring an umbrella or raincoat when you pick up your child/children. There may be a delay in releasing your children as we wait for the rain to subside.

For walkers and student pick-up, both the main walker's entrance gate and the main gate will close at 2:00pm, and will re-open at 2:43pm.

For the safety of everyone, your continued support and cooperation in adhering with the drop-off and dismissal procedures is greatly appreciated. We also ask for your patience, as we think of the safety of everyone.

## Pre-K GATE

The Guam Department of Education (GDOE) announces that open enrollment will resume for select schools for the **Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) Pre-kindergarten program** for School Year (SY) 2023-2024. The application and assessment period will begin **Monday**, August 21, 2023, and end Friday, September 1, 2023.

Children must be four years of age by **July 31, 2023** (born between August 1, 2018 - July 31, 2019) to be eligible to enroll in the pre-kindergarten program for SY 2023-2024. We are only accepting applications for the following GATE Pre-kindergarten school sites. There are limited slots available at each school and placement will be based on your child's assessment scores.

Hard copy applications for **GATE Pre-kindergarten** are available at the GDOE Central Office in Tiyan and can also be downloaded from our website: <u>gdoe.net</u>. For your convenience, applications can be submitted via email to <u>GATE@gdoe.net</u>. Application packets will be reviewed by order of submission. Please ensure your application packet is complete prior to submission.

All application packets must include:

- a copy of the child's birth certificate
- a signed, completed application (2 pages)

#### Deadline for GATE Pre-kindergarten application packet: Friday, September 1, 2023

#### WHAT IS THE K-5 GATE PROGRAM?

The GATE program is an enrichment program focuses on the following:

- How to coordinate and focus student interests and energies into purposeful research, decision-making and action.
- Assessment of learning based more on an evaluation of products rather than test results.
- More focused on student directed learning.
- Teacher of the gifted is as much a facilitator as an instructor delivering information for students to learn.

#### PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

- Public Law 13-26, passed in 1975, mandates the gifted education program for Guam students.
- Provides enrichment for identified GATE Academic students through a pull out program.
- Class size: small groups (not more than 12 students) of gifted students meet 180 minutes per week in the GATE Resource Room.
- GATE teacher works closely with classroom teachers to discuss the needs and progress of each student to assure harmonious transition for the child from classroom to resource room.

### GATE IDENTIFICATION PROCESS:

#### STEP : TEACHER NOMINATION

• Teachers will nominate students from their homeroom classes based on student performance.

#### STEP 2: PRE-SCREENING

- Nominated students will be pre-screened using AIMSWEB Plus results in Reading, Language, and Mathematics. Students must score in the 80th percentile or higher.
- WRAT IV: The student must score with an average percentile of 80 or higher in all three areas: Word Reading, Spelling, and Mathematics.

#### STEP 3: TEACHER RATING SCALE & PARENT PERMISSION FORM

- The student must have a score of 80 points or higher on the Teacher Rating Scale.
- A parent permission form must be submitted to proceed with testing.

#### STEP 4: GATE TESTING

- Students who passed the pre-screening and returned the testing permission form will be given the GATE entrance test by the GATE teacher using the following intelligence test:
  - NNAT3 Naglieri Nonverbal Ability Test

For students who were in the Pre-K GATE Program last school year and for students waiting to take the GATE entrance test, testing will be scheduled in September. More information forthcoming.

> Pre-K GATE classes will begin on Monday, August 28, 2023 K-5 GATE classes will begin on Monday, September II, 2023.




